...Sorry folks, our age has finally caught up with us. As you read through this newsletter you will hear the sad story of our cherished last Pit Pony, Spike, and how tragedy struck our beautiful Bess. Such loss, albeit in the surroundings our sanctuary, is profound. Just a few days later Roy suffered his first Stroke, fortunately a minor one. Unfortunately, just a month later Roy had another stroke, this time a major one. We both feel that we always 'did right' by all of the beloved horses that we have cared for at the centre throughout the 40 years that we have been able to. Keeping up with the day-to-day care demands of the ponies has proven to be no longer possible. Roy is recovering and is doing very well. However, we have have had to make the difficult decision to begin to move retirement. Wendy Valentine, a long-term friend of ours and the ponies as the lead at Hillside Animal Sanctuary in Norfolk has the exact same animal welfare standards as ours. Our objective has always been to ensure the lifetime care of our ponies and so with the support of Wendy and our Trustees, the centres' ponies have now made a comfortable and safe journey to Norfolk. Here they will spend the rest of their days in the manner they are now accustomed to; without work, fear, or unkindness in the beautiful fields surrounding Wendy's home in the middle of Hillside Animal Sanctuary. We look forward to continuing to help them in our retirement.

Bess & Honey... In April this year our darling Bess gave birth to a beautiful chestnut filly who we called Honey – as she is the colour of Honey! We were understandably worried about the foal in Bess' tummy on arrival given the severe trauma that Bess had experienced in the road accident that had brought her to the centre. Honey arrived in beautiful sunshine and had a wonderful first four months at the centre with her mum. In July, due to ill health including internal damage caused by both neglect in early life and the impact of the car crash, her body gave up and Bess sadly passed away at the centre. We believe that Bess is now resting in peace. We promised her that we would take great care of Honey for the rest of her life and would ensure that she never has the life her mother had. Bess knew Honey was safe after she had given her the best start in life and trusted us to take it from here. A very sad time for us at the centre. Bess passed away on a Saturday so no pony feed shops were open and we needed to get foal milk replacement for Honey to ensure she had something to eat! We were lucky, Wendy Valentine at HILLSIDE Animal Sanctuary sent us an emergency parcel of foal milk nuts for Honey. Here Honey is, eating her first portion. We were so very grateful to Wendy and her team at Hillside – THEY SAVED THE DAY.


